WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of the last five games but lost 10 of 16 as they continue their penultimate 10-game, 11-day trip this afternoon with the series opener at Detroit.
- RHP James Shields takes the mound for the White Sox, who are 2.0 games behind Detroit for fourth place in the AL Central.
- The Sox took two of three games at Kansas City, including a 5-3 victory yesterday, to begin the trip.
- The White Sox went 4-6 on their just-completed homestand from 9/1-10, winning two of three vs. Tampa Bay and San Francisco and being swept by Cleveland in a four-game series.
- Chicago was swept in its last trip from 8/29-31 at Minnesota.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have outscored their opponents, 40-12, over the last five games ... they are hitting .360/.392/.614 with 26 extra-base hits, including nine home runs, during that span.
- The Sox are looking to win road games on consecutive days for the first time since 6/16-17 at Toronto.
- James Shields, who has not won a road start this season, is looking to win consecutive outings for the first time in 2017.
- José Abreu is hitting .371/.408/.784 with six doubles, three triples, 12 HRs, 25 RBI and 13 multihit efforts in his last 29 games ... needs eight RBI to record his third season of 30 HR/100 RBI.
- Avisail García has hit safely in 22 of his last 26 games, batting .392/.439/.526 with two doubles, one triple, three home runs, 13 RBI, eight walks and 11 multihit efforts.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- José Abreu snapped a 3-3 tie with a game-winning sacrifice fly in the ninth inning in the White Sox 5-3 win at Kansas City.
- It marked the Sox first road series win since June in Toronto.
- Chicago led 3-0 after five before the Royals scored once in the sixth and twice in the eighth setting up Abreu's sac fly.
- Lucas Giolitto received a ND despite allowing just one run on four hits over 6.1 IP ... became just the 15th Sox pitcher to make four-plus straight starts of 5.0-plus IP and four hits or less allowed.
- Juan Minaya (1.1 scoreless IP) earned his third win.
- Tim Anderson, Yoán Moncada and Avisail García each recorded a multihit effort ... Adam Engel went 1-4 with two RBI.

TIGER TAMER

- James Shields is 5-1 with a 3.03 ERA (21 ER/62.1 IP), 1.07 WHIP and .228 opponents average (51-224) over 10 career starts at Comerica Park ... seven of the outings have been quality.
- Shields has worked 6.0-plus IP eight times, and allowed two runs or less in six of those starts ... he has surrendered just two home runs over his last seven starts at the Tigers (47.1 IP).

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS

- Chicago is hitting .283 (374-1,321) vs. left-handers this season, the best mark in the major leagues ... Avisail García (1st, .423) and José Abreu (5th, .370) rank among the MLB leaders in average vs. lefties.
- García is in position to become the first White Sox player since Frank Thomas in 2000 (.407) to lead the American League in average vs. left-handers (STATS) ... no Sox player since at least 1974 has led the majors in average vs. LHP.

SURVIVE AND ADVANCE

- Class A Kannapolis last night suffered a 2-0 loss vs. Greenville in Game 2 of the South Atlantic championship ... Willy García and Jake Burger recorded two of the Intimidators three hits.
- Kannapolis trails the best-of-five series, 2-0, with Game 3 tonight at 6:05 p.m. CT at Greenville ... RHP Blake Hickman is scheduled to start for the Intimidators.
- Adv. Rookie Great Falls will play Ogden in the Pioneer League Championship Series ... Game 1 is tonight at 6:05 p.m. CT.

PITO POWER

- José Abreu has hit 30 home runs for the third time in his career, and needs eight RBI to reach 100 for the fourth time.
- Below is a list of Abreu's accomplishments and milestones:
 - Looking to become the third player in MLB history to begin his career with four straight seasons of 25-plus homers and 100-plus RBI, joining Joe DiMaggio (1936-39) and Albert Pujols (2001-10).
 - Is the first player in White Sox history to begin his major-league career with four-plus consecutive 25-homer seasons, and the 10th in major-league history to accomplish the feat (STATS LLC).
 - Trying to become the fifth player ever to record 100-plus RBI in his first four-plus seasons ... the others: Al Simmons (1924-34), Pujols (2001-10), Ted Williams (1939-42, '46-49) and DiMaggio (1936-42).
 - His 38 doubles, six triples and 75 extra-base hits are career highs ... is on pace to record career highs in total bases and hits this season.
 - Would be the fourth Sox to lead the AL in TB, joining Albert Belle (399; 1998), Minnie Minost (304; 1954) and Joe Jackson (293; 1916).

WHITE SOX VS. DETROIT TIGERS

- The White Sox lead the season series, 8-7 ... they are 6-3 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 2-4 at Comerica Park ... the teams have been rained out three times this season.
- The Sox are hitting .280/.341/.465 with 19 homers, own a 4.62 ERA (68 ER/132.1 IP) and have outscored the Tigers, 74-72.
- The White Sox have lost four consecutive games, seven of the last nine and 14 of 17 at Comerica Park.
- Chicago is trying to avoid losing its eighth consecutive season series to the Tigers ... the club has gone 59-86 since 2010.
- The White Sox trail the all-time series, 1,047-1,085 ... they are 562-509 at home (125-94 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 485-575 on the road (76-85 at Comerica Park).

LOOKING FOR CENTRAL COMMAND

- The White Sox are 28-38 vs. the American League Central division this season (12-19 on the road) after going 32-44 in 2016.
- Chicago has lost eight of the last 10 games, nine of the last 12 and 18 of 27 vs. the division ... the Sox have scored four runs or less in eight of the last 10 games and 10 of 13.
- The White Sox have gone 285-373 vs. the AL Central since 2009, with their only winning record coming in 2012 (37-35).

30 FOR 79

- José Abreu on Sunday reached the 30-homer plateau for the third time (also 2014-15) ... he is the first White Sox ever to hit 30-plus homers in three of his first four major-league seasons.
- The only other White Sox to hit 30-plus homer runs in three of their first four years with the club are Jermaine Dye (2005-06, '08) and Jim Thome (2006-08).
- The only other foreign-born players to hit 30-plus HRs in three of his first four years are Jose Canseco and Albert Pujols (Elias).

JOSÉ! JOSÉ! JOSÉ! JOSÉ!

- José Abreu on Saturday night vs. S.F. became just the sixth player in Sox history to hit for the cycle, and the first since José Valentin on 4/27/00 vs. Baltimore ... according to Elias, he is the first Cuban-born player in major-league history to record a cycle.
- Abreu joined San Diego's Wil Myers, Washington's Trea Turner, Texas' Carlos Gomez, Colorado's Nolan Arenado, the Dodgers' Cody Bellinger and Tampa Bay's Evan Longoria as players to hit for the cycle in 2017.
- The seven cycles this season are the second-most in MLB history (eight in 2009 and 1933).

RARE AIR AHEAD

- Yolmer Sánchez needs two triples and two steals to become the 10th Sox to record a season with 10-plus 2B/3B/HR/SB.
- He would join Minnie Minoso (three times), Carl Reynolds (twice), Ray Durham, Lance Johnson, Sammy Sosa, Jorge Orta, Jim Rivera, Gee Walker and Mike Kreevich (once each).

LOGBALL LOGISTICS

- Chicago has hit 169 home runs and is on pace to finish with 189, which would mark its highest total since 2012 (211) ... Matt Davidson (24) ranks fourth among Sox rookies, trailing José Abreu (36, '14), Ron Kittle (35, '83) and Zeke Bonura (27, '34).
- Davidson, Tim Anderson (16), Avisail García (16), Yolmer Sánchez (11) and Leury García (nine) all have set career highs in home runs this season.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made 25 quality starts in their last 45 games dating back to 7/29 ... by comparison, the Sox made 12 quality starts in 58 games from 5/22-7/28.
- Chicago is 38-18 when receiving a QS this season.
- Since 2003, the White Sox have recorded 1,308 quality starts, one more than the Mets (1,306) for the most in the major leagues.

NO REST FOR THE WEARY

- The White Sox are currently in a stretch where they finish the regular season playing 33 games in 34 days from 8/29-10/1.
- The Sox only remaining off day is on 9/18 in Houston.
- A breakdown of Chicago's 17 remaining games this season:
 - Ten on the road and seven at Guaranteed Rate Field.
 - Ten vs. the American League Central and seven vs. the AL West.
 - Seven vs. first-place teams (Cleveland; Houston) and six vs. clubs within 4.0 games of the second AL Wild Card spot (K.C.; LAA).

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- The 35-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season, ninth on the road and second vs. Detroit.
● Is looking for his first road win since 5/12/16 (18 starts).
● Has gone 1-2 with a 4.25 ERA (14 ER/29.2 IP), 25 strikeouts and a .200 opp. average in his last five outings (two quality starts).
● Is 0-2 with a 5.53 ERA (26 ER/42.1 IP), 11 homers, 20 walks and 36 strikeouts over his eight road starts this season (two quality).
● Is 7-18 with a 6.14 ERA (145 ER/212.2 IP), 161 strikeouts, 54 home runs allowed and a 1.58 WHIP over 40 starts (16 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from San Diego in a trade on 6/4/16.
● Ranks among the major-league leaders since 2007 in games started (2nd, 348), IP (2nd, 2,268.0), pitches thrown (2nd, 35,5649), opponents GDP (4th, 191), quality starts (T5th, 215), complete games (T6th, 22), shutouts (7th, 9), strikeouts (8th, 1,956) and wins (11th, 130).
● Recorded at least 10 victories, 200.0 IP and 160 strikeouts each season from 2007-2015 ... was the only active major-leaguer with nine consecutive seasons of 200.0 IP or more during that time span.

LAST START

- Snapped an 11 game winless streak on 9/9 vs. San Francisco after tossing a season high 7.0 IP and allowing just one run on two hits with two walks and five strikeouts.
● Allowed a single to Buster Posey in the first ... retired 15 consecutive batters from the first through the sixth before walking Joe Panik ... allowed a solo homer to Nick Hundley in the top of the seventh.
● The two-hit outing was his 17th career start with two hits or less and third this season (last 4/11 at Cleveland).
● Departed the game with the White Sox leading, 10-1, after tossing 106 pitches (69 strikes) ... the Sox went on to win, 13-1.

WORKING TO BOUNCE BACK

- Is 1-3 with a 4.32 ERA (20 ER/41.2 IP), 39 strikeouts and a .216 opponents average over his last seven starts ... by comparison, was 1-3 with an 8.10 mark (36 ER/40.0 IP), .318 opponents average and 1.88 WHIP in his previous eight outings after returning from the disabled list (4/21-6/18; strained right lat).
● Went 1-0 with a 1.62 mark (3 ER/16.2 IP) and a .153 opponents average in his first three outings of the season ... surrendered one earned run in all three starts.

REACHING MILESTONES

- Recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 6/24 vs. Oakland, fanning Khris Davis to end the second inning ... became the 81st pitcher (57th right-hander) in MLB history to reach the milestone.
● Became the fifth pitcher to record his 2,000th career strikeout in a White Sox uniform, joining Javier Vazquez (2008), Charlie Hough (1991), Jim Kaat (1974) and Early Wynn (1960) ... source: STATS LLC.
● Joins Matt Cain, Cole Hamels, Felix Hernandez, Jon Lester, Ervin Santana and Justin Verlander as the only pitchers in baseball to make 10-plus starts every season since 2006.

MISSING THE COMFORTS OF HOME

- Is 0-7 with a 7.32 ERA (64 ER/78.2 IP), 98 hits allowed (19 homers), 42 walks, 56 strikeouts, a .302 opp. average and .956 opp. OPS in his 16 road starts (four quality) with the White Sox.
● Is looking for his first road win since 5/12/16 (18 starts) at Milwaukee with San Diego ... tossed 7.0 scoreless IP with one walk and nine strikeouts.
● Has gone 67-61 with a 4.31 ERA (542 ER/1133.0 IP), 167 home runs allowed, 322 walks and 936 strikeouts over 181 career outings (180 starts) on the road ... 100 of his starts have been quality.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has allowed a home run in 16 of his 18 starts in 2017, and three three-homer efforts ... surrendered a major-league leading 40 home runs in 2016 after leading baseball with 33 in 2015 ... became the first pitcher to lead MLB in homers allowed in consecutive seasons since Tom Browning in 1988-89.
● Has given up at least one home run in 25 of his last 29 starts (43 total), allowed 63 homers since 2016 and 96 since 2015 ... has allowed the most home runs in baseball since 2015.
● Has allowed 1.79 homers per 9.0 IP since 2015, the third-highest mark in the major leagues.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

- Opponents own a .238 average with RISP (19-80) and .263 mark with RISP/two outs (10-38) this season ... has allowed more than one hit with RISP in just six starts this season.
● The opposition is 15-48 (.313) with five doubles, one homer and 22 RBI with RISP in his last 10 games ... by comparison, limited opponents to a .125 mark with RISP (4-32) with one homer in his first eight outings.

SEPTEMBER TO REMEMBER

- Is 23-16 with a 3.83 ERA (152 ER/357.0 IP) and a .239 opponents average over 55 career starts in September ... is 1-1 this season with a 3.38 ERA (5 ER/13.1 IP) and a .170 opp. average (8-47) over two starts.
● Went 1-3 with a 5.79 ERA (21 ER/32.2 IP) and a .252 (32-127) opponents average in six September/October starts in 2016 ... tossed at least 100 pitches in five of the six outings.

FAMILIAR FOES

- Makes his 104th career start vs. the American League Central ... is 33-31 with a 4.08 ERA (296 ER/653.0 IP), 690 hits allowed, 185 walks, 546 strikeouts and three complete games ... is 0-1 with a 5.23 ERA (12 ER/20.2 IP) in his four starts on the road this season.

VS. DETROIT TIGERS

- Is making his 24th career start against Detroit and second this season ... has gone 8-8 with a 4.37 ERA (74 ER/152.1 IP), 15 home runs allowed, 37 walks and 115 strikeouts and .287 opponents average lifetime ... 115 of his starts have been quality, and 11 have been at least 7.0 IP.
● Is 5-1 with a 3.03 ERA (21 ER/62.1 IP), five home runs allowed, 16 walks and 43 strikeouts over 10 career outings at Comerica Park.
● Recorded the win in his last start against the Tigers on 4/6, allowing one run on two hits over 5.1 IP.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER

- RHP Carson Fulmer (2-1, 6.00 ERA) is set to make his third start of 2017, first on the road and first career vs. Detroit.
● Recorded his first career win as a starter in his last outing on 9/10 vs. San Francisco, allowing one run on three hits over a career-high 6.0 IP ... recorded a career high nine strikeouts.
● Made his first start of 2017 in Game 2 of a doubleheader on 8/21 vs. Minnesota ... suffered the loss after allowing six runs on four hits with two homers, three walks and zero strikeouts over 1.1 IP.
● Recorded his first career win on 9/2 vs. Tampa Bay, allowing one run on one hit over 2.0 IP in relief.
● Has gone 0-1 with a 21.60 ERA (4 ER/1.2 IP) and two strikeouts in two relief appearances vs. Detroit in 2016.
● Went 7-9 with a 5.79 ERA (81 ER/126.0 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 25 starts with Class AAA Charlotte this season.
